Mariposa is continuing to develop program models that will ultimately have a positive impact on student achievement. This coming school year, current 3rd and 4th grades currently at Mariposa will be participating in a departmentalized instructional model with the goal of raising student achievement. In the current self-contained classroom you have been accustomed to one teacher teaching all core subjects to a single class of students. In the new model teachers will teach specific core subjects to multiple classes of students and your child will have more than one teacher. Students will transition from a Math Block, to an ELA Block and to a SS/SCI/Health/Writing Block. Each block will be for 105 minutes. There are several benefits for both students and teachers:

Students enhance organizational skills and learn to transition more effectively

Students get natural breaks within their day

Students get opportunities to build multiple relationships

Students are supported by more than one teacher

Students participate in differentiated, flexible groups targeted toward their learning needs

Teachers get to know many more students in the grade level or team, not just "their class"

Teachers have more opportunities for collaboration to support student achievement

Teachers have equal ownership of all students

Teachers will benefit from being able to focus and concentrate on fewer subject areas.

The current Compact Math model will remain intact, making this a more seamless transition.
