




Very important reminders when dropping students off in the morning and/or picking students up at the end of the day:

Be on Time: The first bell rings at 7:25 am and the tardy bell rings at 7:30. Please do your part to help the mornings run smoothly for all students. Per the Kyrene Family Handbook, pg 21, "...Students should arrive on campus at least five minutes before the scheduled start time...", "Students who arrive late (tardy) miss important information including school-wide morning announcements and instructional goals for the day."

Be on Time: On Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, school releases at 2:30PM. Every Wednesday, school releases at 12:30PM. If you are picking up your student after school, please be on time. If there are unusual circumstances and you will be late to pick up your student, please call the office to let them know you've been delayed and when they can expect you to arrive.

No Parking Zones: Sec. 24-59. - Parking adjacent to schools. A) the city traffic engineer is hereby authorized to erect signs indicating no parking upon any street adjacent to any school property when such parking would, in his opinion, interfere with traffic or create a hazardous situation. B) When official signs are erected indication no parking upon that side of a street adjacent to any school property no person shall park a vehicle in any such designated place. Do not park on the south side of Knox Rd. This is a NO Parking Zone. Authorities have been notified.

Helping Your Child Learn Their Multiplication Facts

Christina Tondevold, a Math Guru shared a multiplication chart used to show the kind of the relationships we want kids to build when learning their multiplication facts...starting with the benchmark numbers 5 & 10.

Christina Tondevold shared, "The darker colors are the main facts that kids need to know and then the lighter colors are the ones that you can use the dark ones to help you out with. So, the dark red is the "times 10" and if you know your times' tens, you can figure out your nines based on the relationship between one and two more and less. That's the other key. You've got to have all of these number sense relationships working hand in hand. Same thing with the blue ones. If you know your "times fives," that helps with your sixes and sevens. So the benchmarks of 5 and 10 still play a huge role as kids are moving into multiplication."

We know parenting can be hard! Here is our tip of the week.

Tip #3-Clearly State Your Expectations In Advance

Some undesirable behavior occurs because your child can't act differently, other times it occurs because your child simply doesn't want to act differently. Either way it helps for you to remember that your child can't read your mind. Be sure to give your child one clear instruction so the he/she knows what it is that you want them to do.

-You are visiting at your sister's house and your child has been playing with their favorite cousin. Over the course of the afternoon, toys have been tossed aside and scattered throughout the room. When you say "come on it's time to get ready to go!" your child ignores you completely and continues to play. A better approach might be to say, "All right, time to get going. Alicia, let's start by putting the block in their box. I see it over there in the corner".
