They will interactively learn about each country by looking at maps, pictures, and other artifacts and talking with representatives of each culture. Some booths also feature craft-making and food sampling. Children can then win prizes after having their stamped passports validated. During the evening, families will also be entertained by the KMS Mariachi, the First Grade choir and by the Navajo, Céili and Kerala dancers. The evening will also feature a flag ceremony and fashion show.







Gifted Testing 2019-20. The gifted testing schedule for next year has been determined. Gifted testing is facilitated at sites three times per year. Information about applications due dates, testing windows, and results are available on www.kyrene.org/gifted. Applications for the third round are due on February 3. Please communicate the gifted child find message provided below to your communities. We will have a message for you in May to include in your summer information.

Gifted Child Find Notice.

All public school districts have an ongoing "Child Find" obligation. This means that the Kyrene School District will identify, locate and evaluate all children within their geographic boundaries who are in need of special education and related service. Kyrene makes gifted testing available for students at school sites three times per year by application. Applications are due for the third round of testing for 2019-20 on February 3, 2020. If you think your child may be gifted, please visit the website at www.kyrene.org/qifted for information about gifted education, services, and testing in Kyrene. More information about the child find process can be found at www.kyrene.org/ESS.

Positive Solutions For Families

We know parenting can be hard! Here is our tip of the week.

Tip #5 – **Use "When....Then" statements**-A "when...then" statement is a simple instruction that tells your child what he or she must do in order to earn a desired consequence (what he/she wants to do). This is also known as a contingency statement. When you use a contingency statement, be sure you:

- Give it a positive focus
- State it only once
- Set a reasonable time limit
- Follow through
- Are prepared for your child's response-it may be "NO"

-It's a sunny day and your barefoot child has decided she would like to go out in the backyard and play. She starts outside and you stop her and say, "No...put on your shoes." She starts to throw a tantrum. Here's an alternative approach you might want to use next time. "When you put on your shoes, then you may go outside." You are not just saying "no". You are letting her know what needs to happen in order for her to reach her desired destination.

A message from Principal Fallgatter:

January 13, 2020

Welcome to 2020! As we embark on the spring semester and the remaining days of the 2019-20 school year, I cannot emphasize how important it is to have your child at school at or before the 7:30 AM bell. Encouraging regular school attendance is one of the most powerful ways you can prepare your child for success—both in school and in life. When you make school attendance a priority, you help your child get better grades, develop healthy life habits, avoid dangerous behavior and have a better chance of graduating from high school.

When students are absent for fewer days, their grades and reading skills often improve—even among those students who are struggling in school. Students who attend school regularly also feel more connected to their community, develop important social skills and friendships, and are significantly more likely to graduate from high school, setting them up for a strong future.

However, when kids are absent for an average of just two days of school per month—even when the absences are excused— it can have a negative impact. These absences can affect kids as early as Kindergarten.

For example, young elementary school students who miss an average of just two school days per month often have difficulty keeping up with their peers academically and tend to fall behind in reading. However, when students are able to read on grade level by the end of third grade, which is when kids transition from *learning to read to reading to learn*, they are three to four times more likely to graduate high school and attend college, post-graduate, or professional development classes than their peers who struggle with reading.

On a separate topic, thanks to our family and friends who have made a tax credit donation to Mariposa. Arizona law allows you to make your contribution through April 15th. We use it to fund field trips, Play Works, character education programs, author visits etc. Our goal is to reach \$30,000. If you have not already done so, we would truly appreciate your gift. This will enable us to continue to provide Mariposa's children with these wonderful extracurricular and character education opportunities.

For our families with children who will be going to Kindergarten next year there will be a second Pre-School/Kindergarten Orientation on Thursday, February 13^{th} from 5:30-6:30 PM. It will be held in the Mariposa library. Information about the Kindergarten experience will be shared and it is also a wonderful opportunity to get your child registered for the 2020-2021 school year.

On another note, I would like to invite you to join us our annual Mariposa World Fair on Friday, January 24^{th} from 5:00 - 7:00 PM. On Saturday, February 1^{st} our annual Father/Daughter Dance sponsored by our PTO will be held from 6:00 - 8:00 PM

Join me in this New Year as we continue to work together to maintain the tradition of excellence that makes Mariposa the great school that it is! Your support is truly appreciated! We cannot do it by ourselves and your assistance both in an outside the classroom is very much appreciated!
