What We're Learning...

Language Arts

In reading, we will begin our new reading domain, Early World Civilizations. We will be learning about Ancient Mesopotamia and Ancient Egypt. We will discuss their writing, beliefs, and different landmarks that were important to the people.

Math

In math, we will be adding and subtracting in word problems. The students will be using the strategies including counting on, doubles, doubles plus one, and missing addend equations to solve the word problems.

Science/ Social Studies

This week, the students will continue the science unit about balance and motion. The students will do various investigations and experiments to figure out how to practice balancing odd-shaped objects.

Writing

In writing, we will continue our writing unit on personal narratives with two or more sequenced events, details, and a closure. We will also be editing our work and making sure that our writing contains necessary details and complete sentences.
