Kyrene Instrumental Ensemble Enrichment for Middle School At-Home Learning

ENRICHMENT: Create instrument assembly and care directions for a beginner

SHORT DESCRIPTION: Your task is writing directions for a beginner on your instrument.

MATERIALS:

Worksheet (attached), pen/pencil

OPTIONAL:

Your instrument, a recording device (such as a camera or phone)

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Fill out the worksheet below explaining to a brand-new beginner student how to do the following:
- 1. Open your case carefully
 - a. Think about how you should open the case to prevent the instrument falling out.
- 2. Assemble your instrument correctly
 - a. Include how to put on a reed, how to adjust and rosin bows and how to adjust practice pad stands.
 - b. Consider what materials you need; shoulder rest, neck strap, etc.
- 3. How to clean/maintain your instrument
 - a. How to swab out woodwind instruments.
 - b. How to oil valves and grease corks
 - c. Cleaning rosin dust
 - d. How to store reeds and mouthpieces
 - e. How to loosen your bow
- 4. How to disassemble and store instrument
 - a. Is there a certain order to disassembling your instrument?
 - b. Think about how and where you put parts and materials away.
 - c. Where should you store your instrument with consideration to safety and environment (temperature, humidity, pets).
- OPTIONAL: Using your instrument to demonstrate, create a VIDEO to share with a beginner. You may use the worksheet outline as your script.
