## INFORMATION TO KNOW:

- Sharps and flats ALWAYS occur in the same order in a key signature.
- Sharps and flats are placed on the same line or space of the staff as the note they affect, with the same placement EVERY time.
- They affect ALL notes of that letter name, no matter how low or high the note is written.
- You will NEVER see both sharps and flats in a key signature. You will only see sharps, OR flats, OR nothing (the key of C Major has zero flats or sharps.)
