# Welcome to Preschool....

For those of you who are returning to Brisas, welcome back! For those of you who are new to the preschool program you must be excited and a bit nervous! Please be assured that we are a highly trained staff of professional educators who will do our best to make this a wonderful, fun-filled year of learning for you and your child.

# Class Hours...

- A.M. 8:20 to 11:20
- P.M. 12:20 to 3:20
- Please make it a priority to have your children to school on time as we start our day quickly. We will meet you at the doors with a sign in sheet. When picking your child up, we would also ask that you would be prompt as we usually have other duties to perform and meetings to attend. Please be sure to sign your child out when you pick them up. Thank you for your help in this matter.
- If you are late, your child will be sitting in the office and you will need to park your car and go sign them out from the main office.
- Parking –you will need to find a spot to park and walk your child to the door. (Gate #5) (BB door) If you are coming from Ray in the morning– you will need to park in the lot in the front of Brisas and Aprende. I would recommend that you come in off of Mc Clintock and park in the parking

lot by the Brisas playground. If you are late and gate 5 is closed, it means you need to check in through the office.

# About our staff:

Classroom teacher – Lynn Clapper I graduated from NAU with a dual major in elementary and special education. I have taught in a variety of special needs settings in Washington and Kyrene school districts. I am beginning my 32nd year in Kyrene with 27 of those years being in preschool. I graduated with my Bachelor of Science in Speech and Hearing Science in 1976 and my Master of Science in Speech/Language Pathology in 1978, both from the University of Arizona (BEAR DOWN). I have been working as a pediatric speech/language pathologist for 37 of the last 40 years, but insist that I am not "old", just "well seasoned". I worked 16 years in homes

and clinics with children from birth to five, and 19 years in the Kyrene Integrated Preschool Program both working in the preschool classrooms and completing initial evaluations to determine eligibility for placement in the preschool program. # Change of Clothes

EVERYONE: Since our room temperature varies throughout the day, and we have little control over it, you may want to leave a light weight sweater or jacket in your child's backpack, just in case. **Please remember to label the item.** 

Please send a change of clothes in a plastic zip-lock bag with your child's name on it. Sometimes spills or accidents happen – especially in preschool.

If your child needs diapering, please send in a supply of diapers and wipes, with their name written on the packages. We will send you a note in your backpack letting you know when our supply is running low.

# Transportation

Your child's safety is very important to us. If someone other than you are going to be picking up your child at school, please let us know in advance in writing. If this will be a regular occurrence, please be sure their name is on the AZ Dept. of Health Emergency card. We cannot release your child to anyone but you, the names on your emergency card, or someone you've identified in a written note. Thank you for your understanding. If your child is riding the bus to school, please make sure you call transportation if they are home sick or if you aren't going to need them that day, for any other reason. 541-1700

# Birthdays

Birthdays are special times for children. The district policy is not to send in birthday treats. We will be celebrating your child's birthday in class by having them wear a special birthday crown and singing 'Happy Birthday" to them at snack time.

# Preschool Attire

We are a hands-on program and have lots and lots of messy activities. Please do not send your child in clothes that you do not want to get dirty. The potential for paint, mud, glue, and other stains is great! We have paint shirts and make every effort to keep your child neat, but spills happen (a lot) in preschool. That's how children learn, by freely exploring the materials. In addition, we will be going to the playground daily (except on those really hot days) so we highly recommend tennis shoes for their SAFETY. If your child would like to wear a hat and/or sunglasses outside, please send it/them in their backpack. Please send in a water bottle daily and please be sure that it is marked with their name. This way they will be able to drink in the class during the day and they can take them outside when we go out.

#### Backpacks

We would like to ask that you send a few things with your child on his/her first day of school. Please always send your child to school with a **full sized** backpack that will fit papers and projects going home. Please have their name clearly printed on the backpack. We will check the big pocket in this backpack first thing upon arrival to see if there are any important messages from home, and we will use the folder we gave you to send our important papers home to you! Please check your child's backpack daily.

# Snacks

Please be sure to put your child's name on their snack box or bag. We use this time for matching and name recognition. It is much easier if their name is on it. <sup>(C)</sup> Remember to send in snack items and a drink. We are required to serve healthy snacks so please send in things like vegetables, fruits, yogurts, granola bars, nuts, <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> sandwiches and avoid foods high in sugar like chips, cookies, and donuts.
